



The grass is warm on my paws.


Sniff, sniff. Flowers!

Squirrel! I chase him up a tree.








Mama doesn't see the rabbit hopping.

That rabbit is fast!


He grabs a carrot


and jumps right over my head.

Grrr. My stomach rumbles.


I forgot to eat breakfast!


This is all Mr. Rabbit's fault.

back down his rabbit hole.




The next day, I guard the garden.

I don't wait this time.







Mr. Rabbit pokes his head up.
