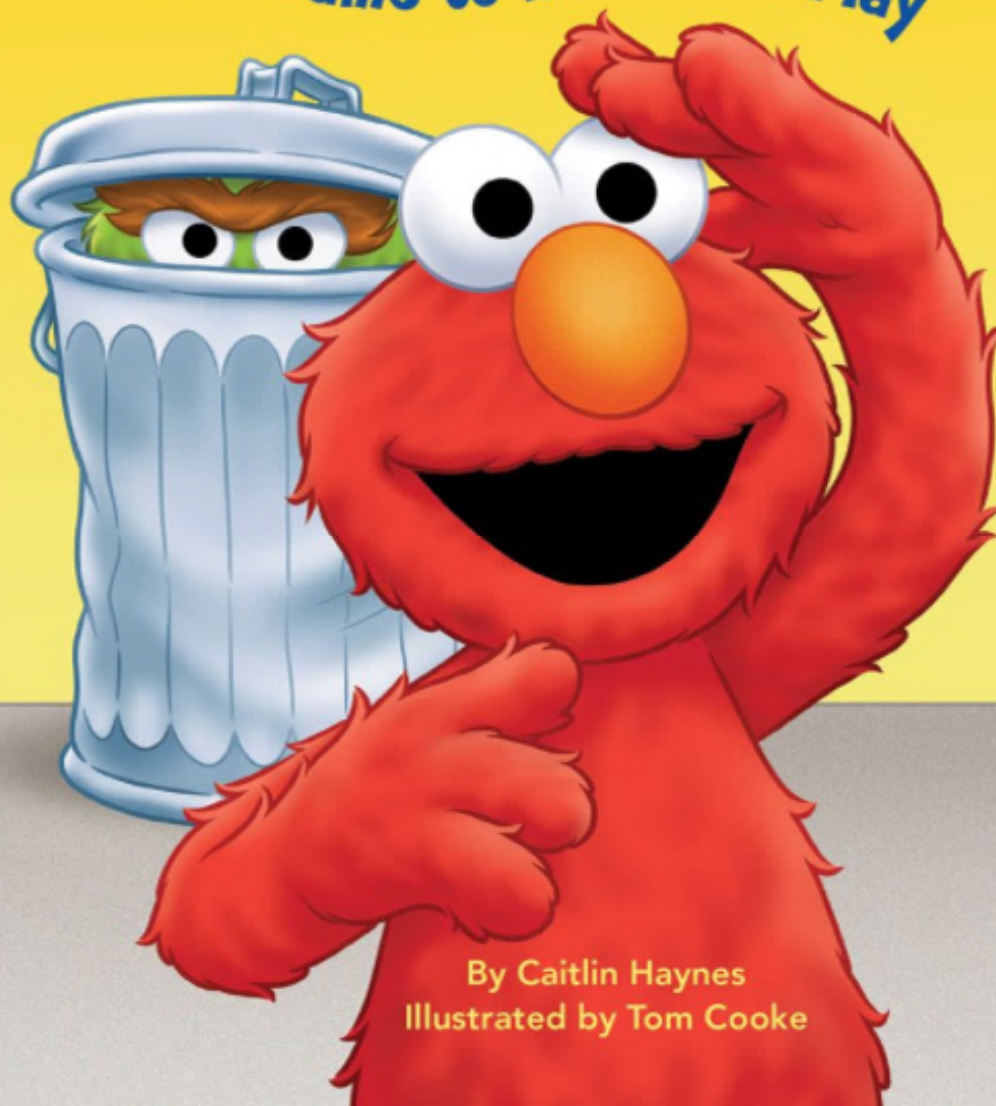

nightcap?



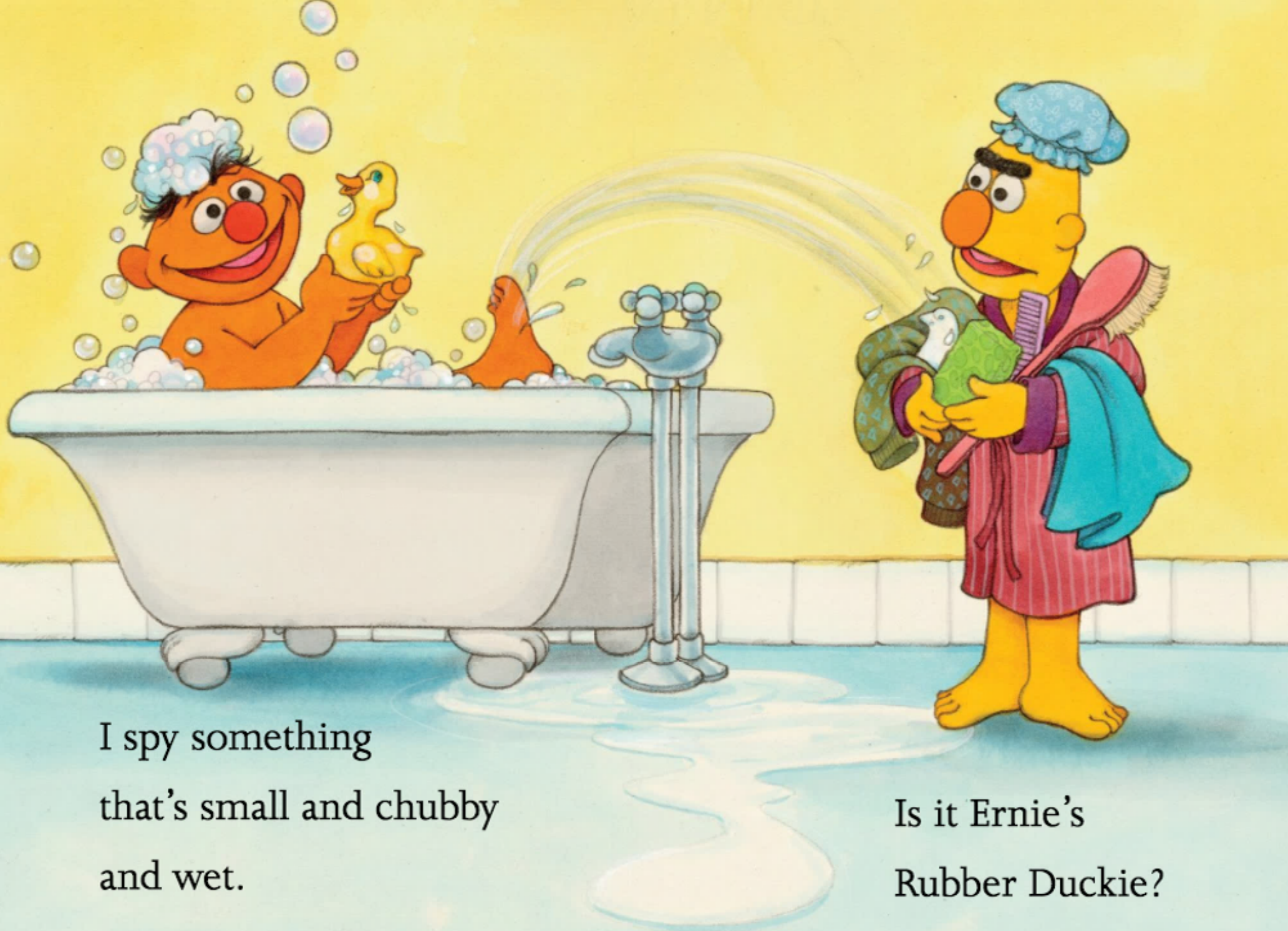
No, it's four monsters

Rubber Duckie?

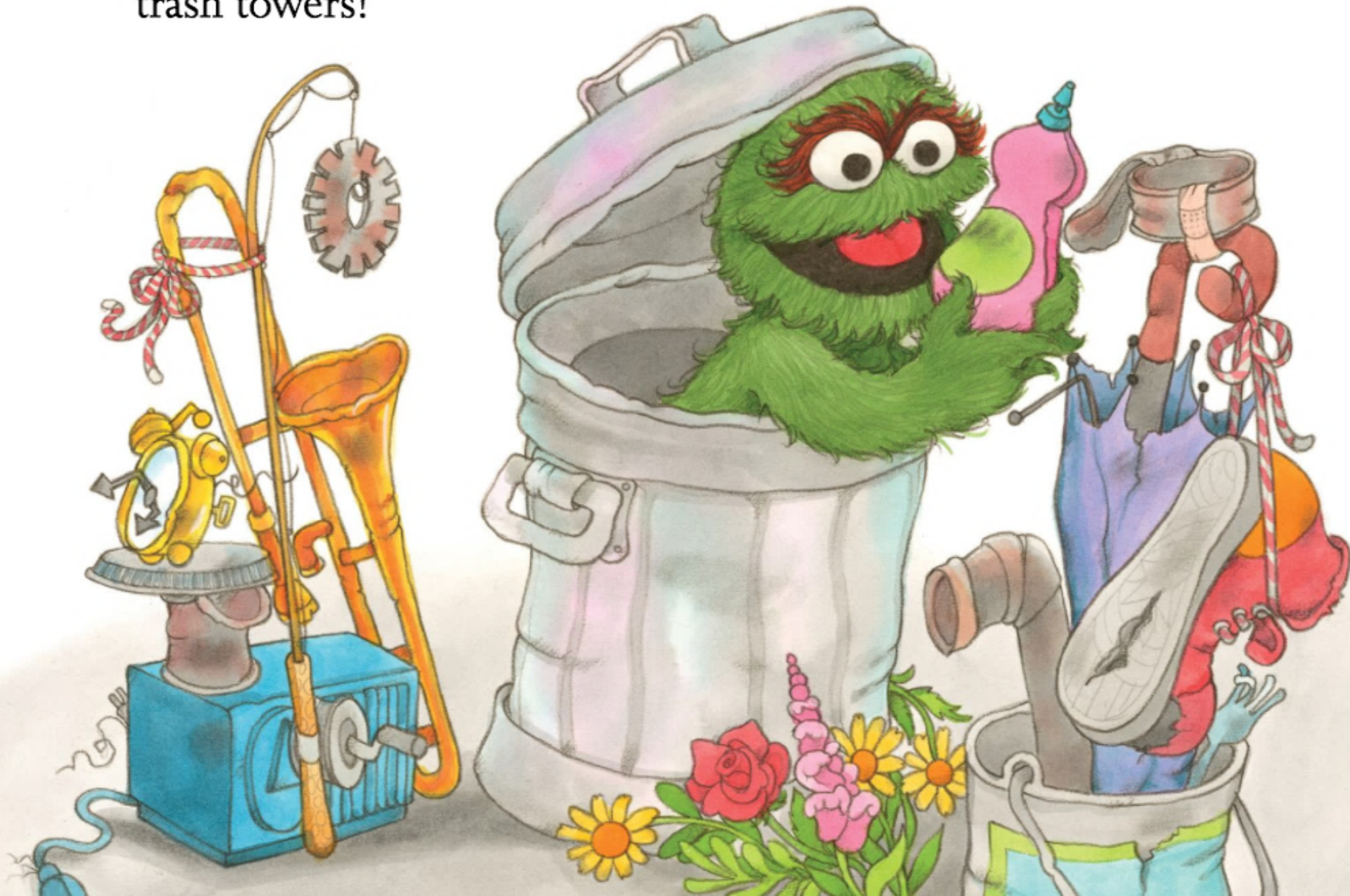
No, it's Bert's soap pet.

trash towers!

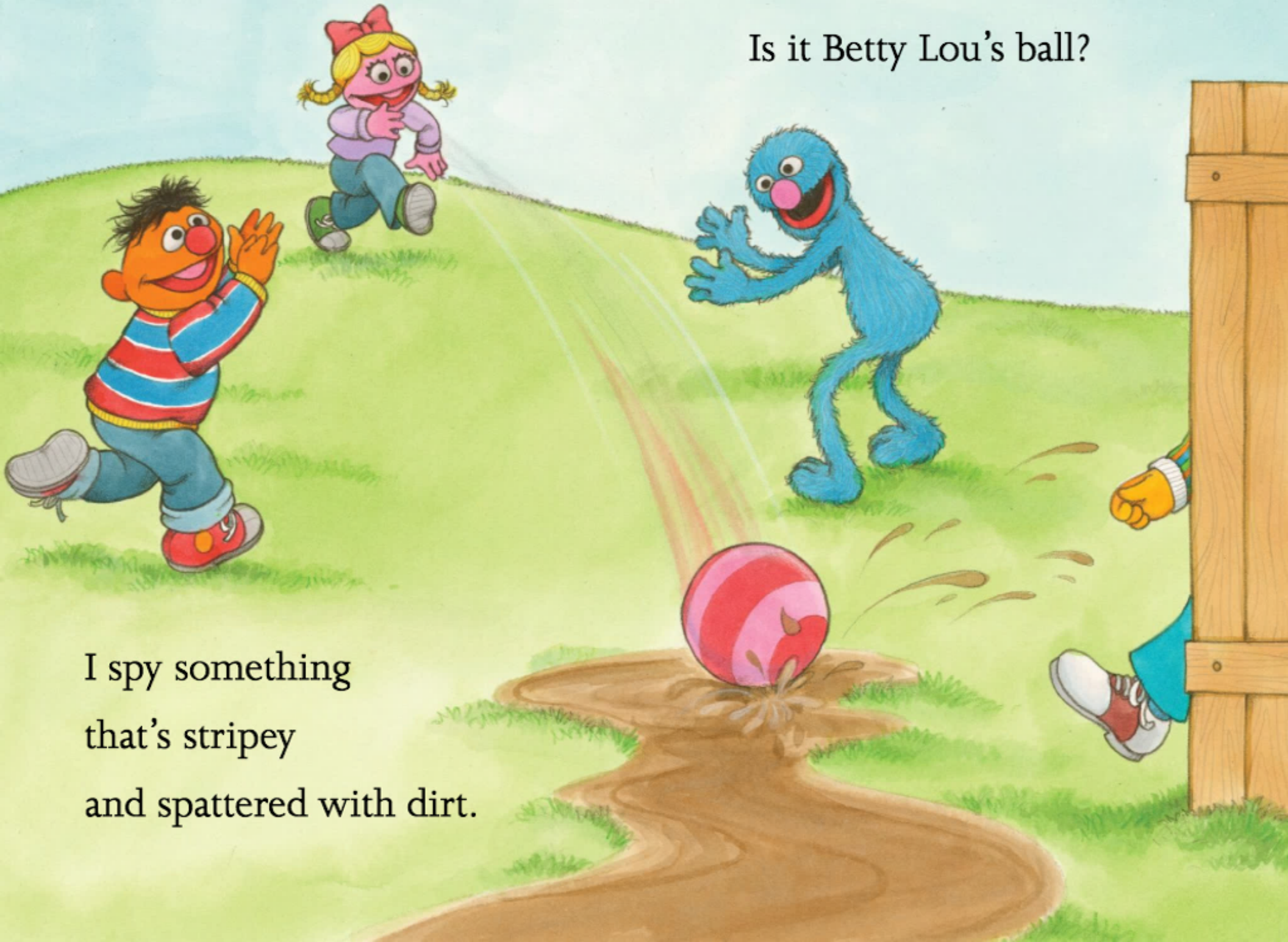




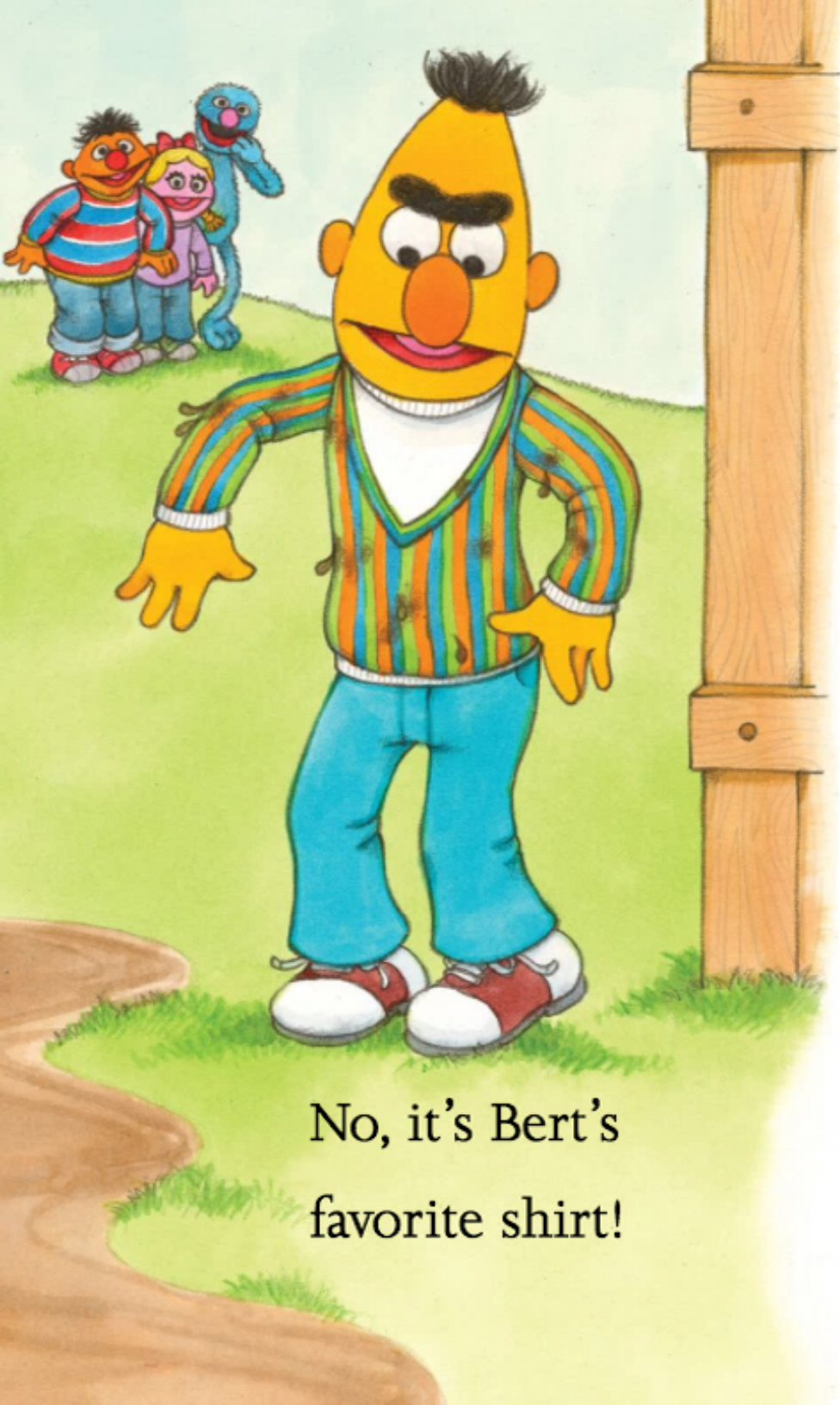
